Embassy of India celebrated 77th Republic Day of India in Equatorial Guinea

The 77th Republic Day of India was celebrated at the Embassy premises with patriotic zeal and fervent enthusiasm at the Embassy of India, Malabo. Ambassador Mr. Prashant Kumar Das unfurled the National Flag followed by singing of National Anthem. Thereafter, Ambassador read-out the Hon'ble Rashtrapati's address to the nation on the eve of Republic Day followed by singing of patriotic songs.

2. The event was attended by around 100 guests which included Indian diaspora and friends of India. In commemoration of 150th anniversary of the composition of the national song of India, a Mass singing of the national song "Vande Mataram" was organized with participation of the members of Indian Community. All the guests joining the occasion enjoyed the traditional Indian refreshments at the end of the event.



3. In the evening, a gala reception was organized by the Embassy of India to celebrate the 77th Republic Day of India at Bisila Palace Hotel in Malabo. H.E. Mrs. Mari-Cruz Evuna Andeme, Secretary of State, Ministry of Foreign Affairs, International Cooperation and Diaspora of the Republic of Equatorial Guinea, graced the occasion as the Chief Guest. The programme began with the traditional lighting of the lamp by the Ambassador and the Chief Guest and playing of the National Anthem of India and Equatorial Guinea by the Musical Band of the students of Colegio Maria Cano.

After the speeches by the Ambassador and the Chief Guest, a cultural programme was also organized in the reception where the students of Colegio Maria Cano sang India's national song "Vande Mataram" and a traditional local song. Dinner was also served at the end of the Programme. Over 100 guests, including the senior officers of the Government of Equatorial Guinea, members of diplomatic community, representatives of the International organizations, businessmen, friends of India as well as members of the Indian community attended the reception.
